Our Agenda for the January 28th Meeting was as follows with key moments noted.

- Member Confidentiality Agreement-All signed, Sharon Lackey is the last member needed to do so.
- Review Communications Policy-We need clarity on the Wragg as a Quarterly or Semi-annual. Is the proposed change official to make it 2x a year?
- Discuss a new Committee name to showcase what our committee can do. After discussion the Committee recommends changing from Communications to Events and Planning.
- Timelines of Special Events. As follows.

Community Events: May be scheduled each year at the discretion of the Communications Chairperson. (Rev. 4/21/15)

1. Wedgefield Road Cleanup to be scheduled for March 7th at 10 am. Patrick Montgomery is the lead POC.
2. Annual Easter Egg Hunt is scheduled for March 28th. Golf Course is allowing us to use the huge land area across from HOA Building. By the tennis courts. Stephanie, and Linda are the lead on this.
3. Community Yard Sale: May 2nd. It is the same day as the Georgetown, Beer and Wine Festival, but the conflict is largely negated as the Yard Sale is an AM event. Jen Lawrimore, and Jen Stoddard are the lead on this event.
4. Annual 4th of July Golf Cart Parade: Amazingly it falls on July 4th again. Committee would like to purchase hot dogs, hamburgers, and grill as a team with volunteers, and ask residents to bring their favorite dishes to share.

5. Wedgefield Day: August 15th. A day to celebrate the amazing people of Wedgefield as well as their talents. Solicit our homeowners to show off their crafting abilities allowing residents to trade, purchase various products. We will also coordinate food trucks and Blood Drive to be on scene as well.
6. Sweet and Savory Cook-Off: October 17th. This date may move due to the Wooden Boat Show. Compete with your favorite Autumn Comfort food for a cool Wedgefield Trophy. Chili? Soup? What you got?
7. Christmas Holiday events:
 - a. Annual Christmas Golf Cart Parade, Luminaries, Tree Lighting, and “Toys for Tots” drive in early December.

We are having discussions on the commercial versus DIY Holiday Decorations with cost, Value, and safety as key points. We are requesting up to \$6,000.

We are moving away from Stand-Alone events like Food Trucks, Blood Drives with efforts to include them into our Event Day's to take advantage of attendees already in place. We are working within the confines of last year's budget for now. As the situation dictates we will adjust accordingly.
